## Early Victories in the Village Cup by David Metcalfe

The Club's 2009 Npower Village Cup campaign got off to a belated start on 24 May with a 3rd Round draw against local rivals Frensham CC. Winning the toss, Frensham surprisingly put Rowledge into bat on a hot day with a fast outfield, a decision they must soon have regretted as the opening partnership of Chris Yates Jnr (65) and Gary Clapham put on 144. With a quick fire 43 from Ricky Yates and 25\* from David Lloyd, Rowledge had set at imposing 293-5.

Frensham found Simon Bonser difficult to get away and sought to attack Ashley Jeggo. However it was Ashley that made the initial breakthrough and Frensham were in difficulties at 45 for 3. Frensham began to fall further behind the run rate against the Rowledge bowling taking wickets at regular intervals. It was mainly due to some big hitting from S. Farncombe (37) and R.Chuter (36) that Frensham posted 188 All Out.

On Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> May, RCC played its fourth round match at home against Newdigate. Winning the toss on a hot day, David Lloyd decided to bat and in the sun the crowd were entertained by an opening partnership of 142 between Gary Clapham and Ben Wish who were not separated until the 21st over when Gary was dismissed for a hard hitting 77. Ben (aged 18) went on to score a fine maiden century with many glorious shots. Ricky Yates (43) and Ian Metcalfe (26) added momentum to take Rowledge to 324 for 4 from their 40 overs.

This was always going to be a very hard task for Newdigate. However they got off to a good start against the young opening attack of Nick Taylor and Ashley Jeggo. Ashley made the initial breakthrough in the 9th over with the Newdigate score at 60. Maintaining a good run rate the Newdigate middle order lost wickets at regular intervals against tight bowling from Ricky Yates and Darren Mitchell. Eventually Newdigate began to fall behind the clock and it was left to the Rowledge 'Legend' Chris Yates Snr to wrap up the innings with a hat-trick, his last one coming some 15 years previously.

The match was well supported by a good crowd enjoying the sunshine. Rowledge will now play the winners for the West End (Esher) and Moreton tie on Sunday 14th June at Home.

## Marvellous Results in May

The early success the teams secured at the start of the season has continued with four wins out of five matches for the Firsts, positioned second in the Southern Premier League 2. The Seconds have achieved three wins out of four and are in third place in Hampshire County Division 3. There have also been good results for the newly promoted Thirds and Fourths. Good luck to all the teams in their forthcoming matches. Let's hope the success continues and Rowledge CC has a memorable season ahead.

## A Word on Membership from Bob Blightman

Most of you probably appreciate that the Club is large, but just to give you some idea of numbers, every year we have about 250 families who are members of the Club, with in excess of 600 individual members. This year the Junior Section (which runs from Reception Year Group to Under 11s) is completely full with 184 members and a waiting list for some Year Groups. In addition, in the Youth Section (Under 13s/15s/17s) we have a further 57 members. We expect that many of these young players will in the future be an important part of our senior teams – and indeed many of the current senior players have worked their way up through the ranks in this way.

The spring is a very busy time for us on the membership front, from the initial mass mailing through to the processing of returned applications, the chasing up of those incorrectly completed (very few this year – many thanks) and Registration Day. Peter Brinsden and I then use the volunteer allocation software we have developed so that we can produce the help rota which we then circulate. We recognise there were a few minor mistakes in this process this year (apologies), and will be looking to re-design the forms next year to try to eliminate this.

This is all a far cry from the early days of the Junior Section in its current form (inspired and brilliantly led at that time by Andrew Harland) when we had no database and Registration Day was chaotic, to put it mildly. I don't think any of us realised just how popular it would be, leading to the need for appropriate administration procedures and the level of volunteer help that is required.

Many thanks to those of you who have volunteered your services; without you none of this would be possible. You should all also appreciate the huge amount of time and effort that Peter puts in to ensure that our junior and Youth Sections are as successful as they are.
