For match report:

A first win of the season for the fourth team against last year's promotion rivals - Dogmersfield. The home team started brightly with the opening pair putting on 34 before Morelli dismissed Jackson and then had Tether (0) caught behind - Keeper Norris parrying the ball to Hill at first slip. Another good stand followed between opener Lewis and Cantell before Ahmed bowled Cantell and Blythe got in on the act with an lbw - the first of his five. Kishore threaten when he returned from injury but Blythe had him well caught in the deep. Then 4 wickets fell on 122 following the dismissal of Lewis (to Blythe, caught Jeggo). The Dogmersfield tail fell off and Blythe cleaned up with good support from Hill.

Rowledge had 53 overs to get their total but did not start well in what should have been a gentle knock prior to tea. Brown got carried away and was bowled playing across the line; Cuss was out lbw and Whittell played horizontally to what was known to be an irregular bounce! At tea Rowledge were 47 for 4 and looking nervously at a small (but seemingly growing) total in the way of their first win. Nicholls and Morelli steadied the ship, but after an unnecessary aggressive shot, Nicholls edged to gully. Norris supported Morelli and almost saw things home but played across the line one time too many. Hill completed proceedings with newcomer Morelli, who finished 30 not out, to reach 123 for the loss of 6 wickets.

First win of the season for RCC 4th XI as all teams did the same and headed home to support England in their first World Cup match.
