Chairman's thoughts...

The senior teams have had mixed fortunes this season.... the 1sts played 16, won 4, and lost 12, but we did beat Basingstoke twice who finished 2nd and I am led to believe they have been promoted to the Premier Division.

The team were missing a couple of players through injury, but it was good to see the youngsters stepping up and doing so well in the 1s when asked to.

Our Overseas player, Tom Treble, was the highest run scorer in the league. We will bounce back up next year.

With some of the players in the 2nds helping out the 1sts, this had a knock-on effect.

The 2nds did not have the same depth of experience as previous years, especially losing the captain to the 1s. Our stand-in captain (Shea) did a great job, after winning the 1st game of the season we had to wait until the end of the season to go on a winning run, where by 0.03 of a point we managed to avoid the drop from CD1. This shows what a great team we had. Most weekends the team had 8 players under 18 yrs. old. To us, staying in this league was the equivalent of winning it! This was a major achievement, they played 14, won 3, lost 11. All the experience our young lads have gained this season will put them in great shape for next season.

The 3rds also had a hard season after winning back to back promotions. Relying on experience as well as new youngsters, we saw some of our older more experienced players moving into the 2s. Carlo started to pick up much needed points after a slow start and with the players beginning to bond together, managed to finish 11th in the league. This was a great performance, especially as on more than one occasion, players were pulled into the 1s or 2s which meant little time to find a replacement. Great job Carlo, he made a difficult job of finding players look so easy most weekends. Played 13, won 3, lost 10.

This season may not have produced the results we would have like to see, but I am extremely proud of all the captains, players and the support volunteers to get three teams out in difficult conditions. This shows great commitment, and this is what our club is all about. I thank all the supporters who came to watch and I hope to see you all again next year.

Cricket in the summer is in many ways the tip of the iceberg. There are so many other activities which only happen by people in the club 'doing stuff' throughout the year.


Our club has 300+ youngsters, fielding 15 teams playing at 5 locations and this requires organising to ensure not only cricket takes place but also to ensure we provide a secure safeguarding environment and we meet all ECB requirements across all aspects of cricket activity.

Here are some examples of what we are currently up to...

This is one of our 12 coaches renewing their First Aid qualification at a course organised by the club and held at the pavilion. This year we also added skills of resuscitation and using a defibrillator.

One of our coaches, this year, Simon King, has attended 2 NE Hants League meetings to discuss rule changes suggested by our

coaches. These are designed to make our cricket more inclusive



This is a mammoth challenge- trying to coordinate opponents, pitches, timings over 5 locations where we play.

Haidee and the two or three coaches have this huge task and will start this in January. We are hopeful of adding Edgebrough School to our current locations of Tilford, Binsted, Weydon, Frensham Heights and of course the Rec!

On the subject of our teams, WE NEED MORE PARENTS to help run and support them. Our year group coaches / managers will be contacting parents to help with organising availability, umpiring, food on the day, running the team at the match. Generally, we need 4 or 5 parents per team. Often it falls to just one or two so becomes a huge job. PLEASE OFFER YOUR HELP when coaches ask for it.

Our winter nets start in February 2018. Dates for these will be published by Haidee soon. Some coaches through their own

efforts have also decided to organise additional nets before Christmas.

 The effort, time and commitment of our coaches is as always fantastic and without them the Junior section would be very different.

Before Christmas we start to sort out our kit requirements for 2018.

Our Friday coaches have asked for additional items and different kit for next year with crazy catchers, air / incrediballs to be used by younger groups as well as a better supply of core kit which seems to 'disappear' during the course of the season.

Hopefully next year we will have 2 additional Level 2 coaches from parents who have volunteered to go on the Surrey Coaching course. This is big commitment in time and something we never take for granted... thanks!

All of this happens before a ball in bowled, a sausage is BBQ'd, a drink is sold, a pitch is prepared, a team selected, a match tea is made, a volunteer given the dates to help, a member is registered, the management committee has met on all the other myriad of actions required to make our club something special. Hard but generally worth it!!
